Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we move towards week five of this term, we have been reflecting on our strategic priorities. Teachers have been engaging in Professional Learning Communities (PLC's) to focus on student data and how we can differentiate the curriculum to improve students individual progress in maths. Alongside this work, the leadership team and teachers will be engaging in Learning Walks where they visit classrooms across the school and offer collective feedback around teachers' pedagogy and practice. Both these approaches, support the school to work in a collaborative manner to improve student outcomes.

Our PBL team have worked with the leadership team and staff to review our classroom and playground procedures. This included, reviewing our playground areas, lunch time clubs, green zone and our supervision roles. Some positive outcomes from this discussion were

- We created two different spaces for soccer /football games to be played and the implementation of new goals.
 - Surveying the students on some new ideas for lunch time clubs
- Teachers using Restorative Practices to solve problems that may occur on the playground.

Once we have finalised the review of our playground procedures, we will email this home to families to discuss with their child.

Last week, an amazing group of talented students performed at Wakakirri, a story dance festival for primary and secondary schools. The group showcased the importance of looking after our own rubbish so we don't pollute our environment.

This was a wonderful opportunity for our students to be part of as they proudly represented the school through dance and acting while demonstrating a range of skills. A big congratulations and thank you to Mrs Reid for her outstanding organisation and leadership of the performance. We appreciate the amazing work you did to ensure students enjoyed this opportunity. A special mention to our teachers, Miss Toivonen and Mrs Mirfin for supporting the students during the auditions, rehearsals and on the night. Thank you to Ms Burling, Mr Heffernan, Mr Herbert and Megan Rogers (parent) for their support on the day too.

A big thank you to the P&C who ran a very popular Canteen Day today. The students were excited to have the opportunity to purchase a treat from the canteen. We appreciate the time and effort that goes into organising and planning an event like this and look forward to exciting and new ideas they have planned for this term.






Year 1 News

We have been lucky to have Paula Taylor from the Chisholm Science Innovation Centre coming to Year 1 each Wednesday morning, to help with our Science unit on 'Light and Sound'. The first two weeks students investigated sound. They looked at different size objects and whether they made the same sound. Lots of discussion about the importance of sound and where it comes from.

The next few weeks we have focused on light. We discussed where light comes from and the students investigated the difference between bright and dim light. They also looked at what happens when you pass light through materials.













This term we joined with the Kindergarten classes to complete gross motor in the old hall. Students have been working on their throwing and catching skills, upper body strength, balancing, climbing and skipping skills.

We have shown great improvement with our movements and cannot wait to see how

much better they will be by the end of the year.

Week 7 sees visiting performances and presentations for both the K-3 and Year 4-6 cohorts.



Cash payments of \$5 per gift, to cover the P&C's costs, will be greatly appreciated, and accepted on the day.


