Principal's Message

Dear Parents and carers,

What a wonderful start to the year we have had. Our students have settled into classes while our staff have provided wonderful learning opportunities to support our students to be successful. Each year, the school leadership team creates a new action plan linked to our strategic priorities. This will be shared with the community in our week 6 newsletter and be reported on in our fortnightly newsletters.

Individual Learning Plans (ILP)

Over the next couple of weeks, teachers will be drafting new ILP's for students who require one. An ILP is a plan created with parents and teachers to set goals and strategies to support students with their learning. If your child is receiving one, their teacher will be in contact with you to arrange a meeting.

Teacher Collaborative Planning

This year we have implemented collaborative planning sessions for our teachers. This is an opportunity for year level teachers to have a dedicated time to plan together with their executive. These sessions allow teachers to look at the curriculum, student data and assessment to inform future planning and implementation of effective teaching practices.

Social and Emotional Learning (SEL)

Social and emotional learning (SEL) is the process that develops self-awareness, self-control and interpersonal skills that are important for success at school, work and life. These skills are linked to the Australian Curriculum and can be enhanced through Positive Behaviour For Learning (PBL). To support students learn these skills, teachers will be implementing the Friendly Schools Plus program from Preschool to year 6. Friendly Schools Plus is a comprehensive and evidence based program recommended by the ACT Education Directorate. Each fortnight you will see references and helpful ideas focussed on identified SEL skills in the newsletter.

Targeted Support

At Gowrie Primary we offer targeted support groups that focus on providing additional support in literacy or numeracy. The leadership team work with staff to discuss student data and identify students who require additional support. This support is offered on a termly basis and targeted at different year levels across the school year. A letter will be sent home with students who will take part in this program next week.

PBL@Gowrie



Gowrie is a PBL school. Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is an evidence-based, multitiered behavioural framework that supports positive outcomes for all students in their social, emotional, and academic development. The focus is on building whole school, proactive systems, and practices, which reduce the need for reactive interventions.

The expectations for positive behaviour at Gowrie encourages students to be safe, respectful and responsible learners. These expectations are clearly displayed for students on our All Settings posters that can be found in classrooms and around our school. These expectations are explicitly taught by teachers and acknowledged through tokens and individual awards which are presented at Gowrie Gathering on a Monday morning.

This term students will be engaging in lessons around the importance of positive behaviours and the school wide systems to support their understanding. Our focus for week 3 will be "Proud to be Seen in the Gowrie Green". Students will be encouraged to take pride in themselves and their school and have the opportunity to collect tokens that will go towards an end of term award for the whole school.




